# Dear Parents/ Carers,

November has been such a busy month for us in school with lots happening. You will have noticed that the weather is much colder, and we would encourage that children come to school in a warm jacket and jumper to help keep them warm. ### The School Gates & Parking

Please be patient when dropping children off. The safety of our pupils is paramount.

When parking vehicles close to the school, on Machanhill, Islay Gardens or Miller Street and the other surrounding residential streets, please park your car safely. Avoid parking on the pavements, across corners and blocking driveways. Please be aware that a Road Traffic Order is in place outside the school and parking on the yellow lines can result in fines being issued.

When dropping children off at school or nursery please use a designated parking space and not the disabled or drop off spaces. Parents should not block the roadway in the car park. Disabled spaces should only be used by people with a blue badge, and this should be displayed when parking. Children should not be left to walk in the carpark unattended.

Rather than bringing a vehicle to school please encourage your child to walk, scoot or cycle to school.

A huge thank you to our visitors who gave up their time to visit and talk to the children about their career choices. Every class had at least one visitor and participated in challenges and events to promote creativity, manufacturing and learned about enterprise. These events included a Kapla Challenge, Dragon's Den and Enterprise is the Business.

Our visitors included Mr Kelly from Barclays bank, Mr Smith, a retired fireman, the fire service with appliance and our local police. We were also fortunate to have dance input for pupils from Valerie

Brown School of Dance, learned how to build a wall from Mr Murdoch a bricklayer, completed fitness circuits with Miss Smith a Personal Trainer and Miss Harnet a content creator demonstrated how to produce content used by charities to spread awareness of topics like poverty. Zeus and Heather, owners of Zeus restaurant in Glasgow visited and talked about owning your own business and shared their knowledge of Greek culture with the children. A special treat was also given in the form of Greek donuts. Mr Clark a local forklift driver also visited and spent time talking to the children about the importance of health and safety in the workplace when using machinery like forklifts.
